ROOTS OF EMPATHY CONTINUES AT BALDONNEL SCHOOL!

Roots of Empathy is an evidence-based classroom program that has shown a significant effect in reducing levels of aggression among school children while raising social/emotional competence and increasing empathy. This Canadian program was developed in 1996 by Mary Gordon and is highly recognized throughout Canada and many other countries.

We will be running two programs at Baldonnel again this year. Mrs. O'Neil and Baby Olivia (pictured below) will be participating in the program in Mrs. Miller's Kindergarten Class. Deanna and Baby Kelal are joining Mr. Gray's Grade 5/6 class (pictured below – bottom right).

*If you have a special talent you would like to share with the school, please let us know. Drama, music, gymnastics, a unique career, special travels ... and the list goes on!



Lock Down Drill



Schools are required to hold at least two Lock Down drills each year. Our RCMP liaison officers, Constable Bough and Constable Dale visited the school and talked to each classroom about the importance of the Lock Down drill. We will be holding our first drill of this school year prior to the Christmas Break. Parents/guardians will be informed of the date/time this is occurring.
